

Gary L. Myers, Ph.D., is vice president of Science and Practice Affairs at the American Association for Clinical Chemistry (AACC). He also is a member of the National Kidney Disease Education Program's Laboratory Working Group, the secretary for the Scientific Division of the International Federation of Clinical Chemistry and Laboratory Medicine, and co-chair of AACC's International Consortium for Harmonization of Clinical Laboratory Results. Previously, Dr. Myers was chief of the Clinical Chemistry Branch at the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. During his more than 33 years at CDC he directed programs to improve and standardize the laboratory measurement of biomarkers used to assess chronic disease status, particularly for cardiovascular disease and diabetes. He received his B.S. in chemistry from Elizabethtown College and his Ph.D. in analytical chemistry from the Georgia Institute of Technology.
