American Society for Nutrition Honors ODS Nutrition Scientists Mary Frances Picciano and Elizabeth Yetley

On April 25 at the American Society for Nutrition (ASN) Annual Meeting in Anaheim, CA, ASN President Robert M. Russell, MD, presented two ODS scientists with distinguished service awards.

Mary Frances Picciano, PhD, ODS Senior Nutrition Research Scientist, received the David Kritchevsky Career Achievement Award in Nutrition "in recognition of an outstanding career in nutrition." The citation reads, "She has influenced public policy through evidence-based research on vitamin D, folic acid, and other nutrients." In previous senior faculty positions at the University of Illinois and then Pennsylvania State University, Dr. Picciano "was highly esteemed for her dedication to students, her fine teaching, her imaginative research on mothers and infants, and her dedication to all things nutritional." The award citation notes her "buoyant spirit, inquiring mind and achievements in nutrition science," qualities that were enthusiastically applauded with a standing ovation as Dr. Picciano accepted her engraved plaque.

Elizabeth Yetley, PhD, retired ODS Senior Nutrition Scientist, and currently an ODS scientific consultant, received the Conrad A. Elvehjem Award for Public Service in Nutrition "in recognition of specific and distinguished service to the public through the science of nutrition." While at the U.S. Food and Drug Administration, notes the citation, she "spent over 30 years formulating and promoting public health policies that are grounded in science," among them directing the folic acid fortification program. At ODS, she "advanced the role of Systematic Evidence-Based Reviews in various nutrition applications, particularly in developing Dietary Reference Intakes."

Dr. Russell remarked that the awards to Drs. Picciano and Yetley showed "the excellent caliber of staff" at the ODS. We would only add that Dr. Russell himself is part of the ODS senior scientific staff as a Special Expert.

ASN Also Honors ODS Senior Nutrition Scientist Johanna Dwyer

In recognition of "outstanding volunteer contributions to support and advance the society," Johanna Dwyer, DSc, ODS Senior Nutrition Scientist, became the first recipient of the American Society for Nutrition Volunteer of the Year Award, 2010.

CARDS Database Updated: Nearly 10,000 Records of Federally-Funded Studies on Dietary Supplements

The <u>Computer Access to Research on Dietary Supplements (CARDS) database</u> holds records of research projects pertaining to dietary supplements funded by the U.S. Department of Agriculture, Department of Defense, and the institutes and centers of the National Institutes of Health (NIH), since fiscal year 1999. The <u>update</u> adds projects funded by the NIH during fiscal year 2008. The CARDS database currently holds 9,852 records.
